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Fear and Faith

One of the times that I was most scared in my whole life was back in seminary. I was on a plane coming back to school after a weekend in North Carolina. At the time, I was taking this Old Testament survey course from a professor who really knew her stuff – and she expected you to know your stuff, too. Every class she assigned weighty, kind of dense readings, articles, and chapters about various books of the Bible. Then, on top of that, she asked us to read that book of the Bible in two different translations.

So, I'm on the plane, trying to be diligent and finish my work and I'm reading a passage very much like the one above. The descendants of this guy....the descendants of that guy...and here's how many there were. Now, I love the Bible. It makes my heart sing and it challenges my faith and learning from it and being changed by it makes the whole world come alive. But some parts of it are just a bit...more difficult to connect to.

I'm on the plane when, all of a sudden, one of the flight attendants began to make an announcement. She was still smiling. She was still using that sunny, shiny, flight attendant voice. But she was informing us that, unfortunately, we were going to need to do an "emergency landing" so we would all need to learn the "brace position." I do not believe she ever used the word "crash," but we all knew what she was talking about.

We didn't get too much information about what exactly the problem was. I remember her saying, "we'll probably be fine, but we want to be in this brace position just in case." Instantly, my mind was racing, "is this true? Is this only a precaution in the very unlikely event that things go wrong or is she just <u>saying</u> that so that we'll all be calm and not panic?" She proceeded to explain how to brace ourselves: lean forward, hands on the seat back in front of us, head down. She said she would let us know when we needed to get into position.

At that moment, everything in the plane seemed fine. There was no turbulence – no rough ride or scary engines noises. Still, there we were waiting for something maybe awful, maybe nothing. I've never been on a plane that went that silent that quickly or stayed silent for that long. I prayed in panic and I know I wasn't the only one. After a little while, though, I could tell that I couldn't focus on my prayers. I needed something concrete to put my focus on so I could keep it together. I looked down at the Bibles open before me and thought, "what better thing for a Christian to do than read the Bible?"

So I read: "The descendants of Simeon by their clans: of Nemuel, the clan of the Nemuelites; of Jamin, the clan of the Jaminites; of Jachin, the clan of the Jachinites; of Zerah, the clan of the Zerahites; of Shaul, the clan of the Shaulites. These are the clans of the Simeonites, twenty-two thousand two hundred. The children of God by their clans..." After each individual chapter, I read the exact same chapter over again in the other translation. Before too long, I was totally frustrated and overwhelmed. I started to rail at God. "God, how could you do this to me? Why couldn't it be some passage that would move me and comfort me more easily? Why not 'the Lord is my shepherd' or 'I am the way, the truth, and the life'? Why did it have to be practically unpronounceable names and endless, endless numbers?"

Then it was like a little miracle happened. God helped me to step back from my fear and frustration. I realized, that I was a follower of Christ, called to study the word and to be guided and forever changed by it. At that moment, I was called to study that particular part of the Bible – no matter how incomprehensible it was to me. So, I realized that the most faithful thing that I could do would be to keep reading – to keep reading as long as I could. In my "mind's ear" I tried to sound out all those names. Every times a census number came up, I tried to imagine all those people – the vast family of the children of God.

I had no control over the situation whatsoever. I couldn't make it better (or worse, thankfully). All I could do was pray and hope and trust in God to see me through no matter what happened. I started to see how all the spiritual disciplines that God has given us: prayer and Bible study, worship, connecting with one another in love and service – these were given to us for the best and worst of times. They help us to see how God is still there, still working no matter what happens in our lives or in the world. They help us see that we're all in this together just like every single one of us on that airplane that day.

I'm happy to report to you all that, though we braced for a crash landing, the plane ended up landing with relatively few bumps in the road. We all made it and a man sitting near me shared some celebratory almonds.

I've been thinking about that day a lot lately as we've been social distancing and now sheltering in place because of the corona virus. We don't know what will happen. We don't know how bad things will get, but we still have prayer, Bible study, worship, and ways to reach out to be there for one another. We hear the promises of our faith: that God is with us, that Christ goes before us, that the Spirit carries our hearts every moment of every day. In these scary uncertain times, let us remember that we are an Easter people – forever joined to Christ in life and in death. Just as he rose, so shall we rise. Do not be afraid: Easter is coming and Easter is here. Thanks be to God! Amen.

Lenten Devotional Calendar


