Have you ever cracked an egg open, and instead of immediately throwing away the shell, looked at the pattern of its break? When I started to cook for myself, I often tried to break the egg so cleanly that I could put it back together again just by lining up the shell again.

Not surprisingly, this is usually a futile effort. Once you've broken into the egg, it'll never be the same again.

When God broke into the world, it's much like the egg – the world is never the same again. Unlike the egg, though, God's revelation to the world brings good news and healing grace. God is putting the world back together exactly the way we can't. And we celebrate this wonder at Epiphany.

Twelve days after Christmas Day is the celebration of Epiphany, which means the revelation of God to the world. In the church year generally, the day of Epiphany is followed by the Baptism of the Lord Sunday — and often gets overlooked. After all, since the Christmas displays are going up earlier and earlier, we can feel like Christmastide should just be over already: "Let's move on to the next thing; don't we know about the wise ones visiting the Baby? Didn't the pageant cover all of this?"

The problem is, of course, that nothing can ever contain how amazing it is that God broke into the world, becoming one of us, living as a human, and revealing Godself to us. The wise ones are stand-ins for all the nations of the world, recognizing God's presence, and worshipping God together. Their gifts recognize the brokenness of the world, and our desire to join with God in its repair.


Frankincense – Faithfulness. Used in worship to help direct the mind and heart to God. Myrrh – Continuity. Used in burials to honor the dead, remembering God even after death. Gold – Purity. Used to show royalty and to reward labor

You see, our world is broken by sin, and can't be put back together by our hands, the ones that broke it. But God works in the world to repair the damage: to our relationship with God; to our relationship with each other; and to our relationship with creation. And though the world cannot be repaired to be exactly the same as it was, it can be repaired to be exactly as God desires.

And when God reveals Godself to us in Bethlehem – and in Nazareth – and in Jerusalem – and even in Tulsa – God's love and care for our broken world is worth celebrating.
