Where's the Love?

"Now large crowds were traveling with Jesus; and he turned and said to them, 'Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple.""

-Luke 14:25-26

There's nothing quite like the rush of a Christmas celebration. We spend all that time running around, planning, working hard – and then the day finally arrives. Sure, sometimes things go wrong. Sometimes fights break out. Sometimes we face hard circumstances that distance us from Christmas joy. But even in those times, we can dwell in bittersweet memories of the past and remember how great Christmas can be. Jesus has come – let the earth be glad! There's new life and new hope for all.

But Jesus doesn't remain a little baby for our "oohs" and "aahs." Some of his teachings are astounding, confounding – and I mean confusing! We know how often the Bible talks about God as a God of love, about Jesus

sent into the world because, "God so loved the world." So where does this talk of hate come from all of a sudden? I don't know about you, but I'm certainly not prepared to hate myself, my parents, or my brother. (If we had kids, I'm thinking we wouldn't hate them either.)

On the other hand, we all want to be faithful disciples, right? Otherwise we wouldn't be here – working hard, trying every day to serve the Lord. So, what is Jesus telling us? When we think of "hate," we usually think of intense negative feelings toward a person or an idea or an institution. Often, these feelings lead us to want to attack, destroy, or devalue whatever it is that we hate. You will likely be relieved to know that that is not what Jesus is saying in this passage.

In Greek, the word used for "hate" is less about a fiery feeling and more about moral choice. When we look at our lives and our actions, we put more weight and value on some things than on other things. Jesus isn't advising us to be filled with unqualified rage towards our loved ones. He's saying that to be his disciple, we need to elevate Jesus— even before our own lives and family connections. What he's really saying is, "don't make me an afterthought, pushed behind every other concern in your life. Seek me first."

Jesus is preaching to people whose views are becoming transformed and, yes, sometimes that put them in conflict with their families – with those they loved more than anything. Yet, he encourages them to stay the course, to keep following the light of God, to trust that the Spirit is holding us all together. In Matthew 19:29, Jesus tells is followers, "everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or fields, for my name's sake, will receive a hundredfold, and will inherit eternal life."

When we look to Jesus, when we offer our lives to him and entrust them to his care, we find that we have not lost what we have offered. Rather, Jesus turns our offering into a blessing of love for us and for the world. As we head into the new year, remember that God's blessings flow steadily – even when times are hardest. Remember that God is working in your life, giving you strength for the new day, preparing you for an inheritance in glory. The love is there and, in Christ, it keeps on growing. Thanks be to God!

Fellowship News


