

From the Pastor's Pen



Love your neighbor as yourself. ~Luke 10:26

In the Gospel of Luke, a lawyer asks Jesus, "Can you tell me exactly who my neighbor is?" Jesus answers him with the story of the mugging victim and the passers-by. Those who would be expected to help – the priest, the Levite – they kept walking. But the man's rival, a man who would never be expected to help a Jewish man for any reason – he's the one who stops. Who offers his own food and drink, his own clothing, to bind up the man's wounds. Who carries him to shelter, who pays for his care. After all this, Jesus asks the lawyer, "Which of these is a neighbor to the man who was robbed?" The lawyer answers, "The man who showed compassion."

Exactly who is my neighbor? You'll never know for certain until you show compassion.

Indeed, Dr. Amy-Jill Levine, a Jewish professor of the New Testament, points out that in Hebrew, the word for neighbor – rea – and the word for evil – raa — share the same consonants. In written Hebrew, which leaves out the vowels, they would be written identically. So, when Jesus asks the lawyer, "How do you read the Law?" he may even be asking if the lawyer is reading it

as "love your neighbor as yourself" or "love your enemy as yourself." Or... both.

Who is your neighbor? Who is your enemy? Jesus suggests we show compassion to both.

And what is compassion, exactly? In English, this word has lost a great deal of its punch. We talk about showing compassion in everything from offering a generous tip to allowing a person with disabilities past you in line. Mind you, these are good things to do. But the Greek word that we translate as compassion is a lot more visceral. It means "to be moved in the inner parts" – or more understandably, "to feel it in your guts." It's the stomach-churning realization that you can't possibly do anything else other than help a person in trouble.

Looking around, we are inundated with news that brings that stomach-churning compassion to the surface. Whether its children being separated from parents, or general fear for the future, it's hard to avoid that feeling these days. We need to listen to that compassion like the despised one did. He felt moved in his guts to help the man – his neighbor, his enemy – as best he could. To rebuild their home, the Jewish people needed to free the oppressed and take care of outsiders. We must do likewise, feeling in our guts the injustice of our society, and work to improve it.

We must call our leaders to "act justly, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with God" (Micah 6:8). We can rebuild our understanding of neighbors – to see even our enemies as worthy of love. To recognize our shared heritage as God's children in the world.

May you be on the right road at the right time to be moved in your guts to compassion, and offer God's help to those in need.


