A few days ago a member of the congregation told me, "Pastor, I love the way you walk to the baptismal font and put your hands in the water before saying the morning prayer." Praying with you all in morning worship is one of the most treasured acts I do as your pastor. To center on God is why we come to worship, and prayer allows us to focus in one moment together as the one body of Christ. Prayer is one way we can put aside all the many distractions we try not to bring into the sanctuary. I believe, fervently, that when we pray God listens.

To communicate with the holy is a necessary part of being a Christian. We all pray. But, like everything else in our distracted lives, more often we pray on the fly or at a moment of calamity. Before becoming a pastor, when I worked downtown, my convenient TOD to pray was in my car alone driving down the Broken Arrow Expressway. I justified by calling it 'my little conversations with God.' Today, I'm not really sure I should be very proud about that! I had sincerity of heart, but not the singularity of focus.

Henri Nouwen, a greatly admired spiritual leader, in his book *The Only Necessary Thing* (Doubleday, 1999, p. 37) gives us some profound advice for our prayer life when he writes: *There are many ways to pray. When we are serious about prayer and no longer consider it one of the many things people do in their lives but, rather, the basic receptive attitude out of which all of life can receive new vitality, we will, sooner or later, raise the question: "What is <u>my</u> way to pray, what is the prayer of my heart?" Just as artists search for the style that is most their own, so people who pray search for the prayer of their heart. What is most profound in life, and therefore most dear to us, always needs to be properly protected as well as expressed. It, therefore, is not surprising that prayer is often surrounded by carefully prescribed gestures and words, by detailed rituals and elaborate ceremonies.*

In reflection, I realize I have my own gestures and words. In worship at prayer time I do go to the baptismal font (a ritual), and swish my hand through

the water (a gesture), and often begin prayer with 'Good and Gracious God' (words). All take away from distractions and allow us to focus on God. Surely we do this in our private prayer time, too. Do you have a prayer palette — place, time, gestures, words, and rituals? What helps you express the prayers of your heart?


As I encouraged in worship, I do hope you will singularly focus your prayers on the work of the Pastoral Nominating Committee members: Debbie, Nancy, John, Katie, Valerie and Scott. As they continue their daunting task of finding our new pastor, let us find our personal ways to put our distractions aside and focus on God. Dare to pray boldly for that yet-to-be-known person to hear the heartbeat of God telling him/her to come our way that we may receive the new vitality God wants for this worshipping family.

Same Kind of Different as Me is the story of the faith hope and love of one woman, Deborah Hall. 


