God of Zion, to you even silence is praise.... when wrongdoings become too much for me, you forgive our sins.... You visit the earth and make it abundant, enriching it greatly by God's stream, full of water. You provide people with grain.... You crown the year with your goodness; your paths overflow with rich food. Even the desert pastures drip with it, and the hills are dressed in pure joy. ~ Psalm 65:1, 3, 9, 11-12

Travelling the rural byways of Oklahoma, you see a lot of cattle. A wise rancher in New Mexico once told me that if you see cattle lying down, they are most likely happy – that they feel safe enough to be vulnerable, safe enough to rest. It's something that Elana and I have taken to heart, noticing on long drives whether the cows are lying down, and wondering about how they're doing.

Now, out in New Mexico, the grass that can grow in the high plains is yellow-green, tough and spread out, since there's not enough water for the denser, greener grass to grow.

So the cattle need a LOT of room to graze, and are often moved from pasture to pasture in order to let the grass recover and regrow. During our move to Tulsa, we noticed that as the grass along the highway got greener, the cows we saw were less likely to be lying down. At one point, Elana turned to me and said, "I just want to tell them, 'You cows don't know how good you have it! Look at all that amazing green grass!"

It's easy for us to take the green grass for granted. To not be aware of all the little blessings that God has provided in our lives. But as we look around this Spring, and see the grass return to active green, and witness the budding of trees, it's an excellent reminder of how God renews and restores us, throughout our lives.

That's why we fast during Lent – to help us be more aware, to remind us to be connected more fully with God's abundant blessings. It's a bit strange, I know – to take something away in order to be aware of it – but it's a very effective reminder to stop, think, and pray. Some folks like to choose one thing to give up for the whole season, which can work very well – but others like to fast from something new each day. To that end, Pastor Elana has put together a wonderful Lenten Devotional Calendar, with something to pray for, something to fast from, and something to act on each day, as inspiration and help for the practice. There's not an expectation to do all these things – but you can see what inspires you!

The point of Lent isn't to be miserable – but to help us see the blessings that God has provided us with, and ways that we can use those blessings to help others. I pray that this season is renewing and restoring for you, and that, once renewed by God's abundance, you are excited to reach out and share God's love with all you meet.




Vacation Bible School 2020
