

From the Pastor's Pen



Brothers and sisters, we urge you to warn those who are disorderly. Comfort the discouraged. Help the weak. Be patient with everyone. Make sure no one repays a wrong with a wrong, but always pursue the good for each other and everyone else. Rejoice always. Pray continually. Give thanks in every situation because this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

~I Thessalonians 5:14-18

The sunrises and sunsets have been particularly beautiful lately $-\,\rm I$ say "particularly" because of the particulates of smoke hanging in the air. With fires continuing to burn throughout the West, from California to Colorado, it's not a huge surprise that smoke has clouded the atmosphere. Yet, just this week, we received some amazing news: heavy snowfall in Colorado effectively stopped the wildfires in that state, the two largest in its history. Despite thousands of person-hours dedicated to stopping the fires, it was ultimately the power of God's natural creation that brought an end to the dangerous disaster in the state.

If we've learned anything during this pandemic, it's that we do not do well when it is obvious that things are out of our control. But the truth is, it's never really been in our control in the first place. Sure, we can do things that help mitigate a bit of our troubles – and we can likewise do things that make our troubles worse.

But, ultimately, it is "God's will for us in Christ Jesus." As difficult as things are, we know that God is good, and God's love for humanity is greater than we can imagine. We will get through these challenges, "praying continually" for the Spirit's guidance on our way forward. Even though we do not have ultimate control, we are encouraged to act nobly and righteously – "pursuing the good for each other and everyone else." We're called to do what we can, knowing that God's love can and will flow through us into the world.

When Paul wrote his first letter to the church at Thessalonica, he encouraged the church to "rejoice always... [and] give thanks in every situation." When times are good, that advice is easy to take – but when times are difficult, it becomes even more important. Paul's leaving of Thessalonica was not under good circumstances – the civil authorities thought he was a rabble-rouser, and kicked him out of the city after just several weeks of preaching and teaching there.

In the midst of all of the troubles that Paul faced, he still advised the church to "rejoice always" and "give thanks in every situation." Because, ultimately, it is our hope in Jesus that allows us to rejoice and give thanks. That hope doesn't go away because of the circumstances we face on earth – far from it. Instead, our hope in Jesus lends us the strength to rejoice in the midst of troubles, to give thanks for what God has blessed us with – knowing that everything in our life is a gift of God.

And so, I thank God for you – for your faith, for your love, for your patience, and for your hope. I am grateful to God for you, and I am grateful to each one of you for how I see God working in each of your lives.


All Saints Day is Sunday, Nov. 1st.

This could be in part because we didn't have a clean-up in Spring. Little did we know at that time that we would be leaving it to the creatures for this Covid period.





<u>Prayer Service</u> – There will be an on-line prayer service November 3rd at 7:30 p.m. This service will be held after the polls close on election day and will be a service seeking calm and unity.

In person worship has been growing in attendance. We are doing everything we can think of to keep people safe and healthy. In order to enter the church, you must be wearing your mask. If you do not have one, there are masks available for you to use. After you enter the church your temperature is taken, and an usher will escort you to your seat. Worshippers are asked to remain in their seat until the end of the service. Worshippers are placed in seats at least 6 feet away from others. Only every other row of chairs in the sanctuary is available for use. At the end of the service ushers will dismiss each row allowing time for others to leave the sanctuary. Sadly, at this time the choir has not been able to rejoin the worship service and no hymns are sung. However, Erik Collins has provided us with a beautiful musical interlude during the service every week. The Bell Choir has also gifted us with their music on several occasions.




Favorite Trinity Youth Memory


