### From the Pastor's Pen



Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed...

Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed...

After [Jesus] had dismissed [the crowds], he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray. When evening came, he was [still] there alone.

~ Mark 1:35, Luke 5:16, Matthew 14:23

Last month, Pastor Elana and I took a "vacation" – our first for 2020, and our first ever "staycation," enjoying the opportunities to be at home without other responsibilities. During the week, however, I spent a day alone, backpacking and hiking over at Robbers' Cave State Park. It has been years since I was able to go on a backpacking trip, and I had forgotten just how spiritual it can be to spend time alone in nature.

Now, I know that it seems weird to be craving alone time during a pandemic – after all, isn't that what we experience all the time? But being able to intentionally withdraw into nature, to spend time hiking and praying, is a very different experience from being socially distanced. It was a time of recharging, of reconnecting with God – and of experiencing God's presence in the wonders of creation and the joy of discovering what's around the next bend.

During the night, when the chorus of frogs and cicadas were doing their best to drown out any other sounds, I decided to sing back to them. I sang the songs on my heart – starting with the Gloria Patri and Doxology, winding through "Our God is an Awesome God" and "Be Thou my Vision," and ending with the Scouting favorite, *Taps.* "Day is done – gone the sun - from the lakes, from the hills, from the sky. All is calm! Safely rest. God is nigh."

All four gospels remark on Jesus' tendency to need to spend time alone in the wilderness – and not just the 40 days we talk about in Lent! Whether he went out for a day trip (Luke 6:12-13), or took a boat across the lake (Matthew 14:13), or even hiked for five days on his own, from Galilee to Jerusalem (John 7:10), Jesus took time by himself quite often. When things get overwhelming for us, even socially distanced and isolated as we are, maybe we can follow Jesus' example and spend time intentionally in prayer and connection with God. You don't have to go up a mountain, or out onto a lake – maybe take a walk through a park, or a garden. Sing a song, if you feel one on your heart, or just sit and feel God's presence with you.

And then, once your connection with God is rekindled, be sure to return to living life with the love you've learned. Be willing to reach others, to share the light that lives in you. For while Jesus went away into the wilderness, he always returned to teach and preach, to heal and feed, to laugh and cry with his close friends and with the crowds that wanted to see him.

Hopefully, we'll be able to soon worship together, in person, again. Until then, share your light through phone calls and notes, emails and video calls. And know that you are loved, in the wilderness or at home, by God and by each of us at Trinity.

## **Rally Day Communion**



### Trinity Family:

After fourteen days of new COVID-19 cases falling in Tulsa County, the Session has voted to allow Phase 3 (in-person worship inside the church)! Assuming that new cases remain flat or continue falling, we hope to resume indoor worship at 10:30 on September 6.

These services will be modeled on the prayer services we've been holding outdoors - there will be assigned seating from ushers, masks will be required, and there will not be vocal music for the time being. Children and youth are welcome to worship in the sanctuary, and very young children are welcome to play outside on the playground with adult supervision (provided), though there will not be indoor Sunday school at this time.

Online worship will continue as well, for those who are not yet able to return to in-person worship. Virtual Sunday School will continue at 9:15 as it has all Summer long.

Trinity's Session has also put into place contingency plans for future spikes in cases. If the 7-day average of new cases trends upwards, we will move the service outside, following the outside protocol (phase 2.5) until it is safe to move inside again.

Thank you for your encouragement and care during all of this uncertainty. We are doing everything we can to remain a safe place to worship and serve.



 Our Recycle Bin has been moved to the south-east corner of the parking lot, away from the adjacent neighborhood. Please continue to utilize our community recycling bin!




## Midweek Book Study
