

As we kick off the new year with our Rally Day service, I am strongly reminded of the scripture quoted above, that Jesus wanted us all to be one. One in the Spirit – one in the Body of Christ – and one in Love, as God has loved the world.

But like the Trinity, it is not enough to be one – we must be a community in one, also. The divine mystery of three persons sharing one essence (as the early church painstakingly worked out) means that even as one in Spirit, Body, and Love, we also maintain our uniqueness, just as the Father/Son/Spirit maintain their uniqueness. It is confusing – and yet, it ought to be comforting, too.

My great-grandfather, Rev. Charles John Keppel, had an analogy that helps explore this idea. He suggested that we think of a ship's wheel, perhaps similar to the one pictured here. You can see that there are a number of spokes, and if you use a little imagination, you can imagine tiny people on each spoke, living their lives, moving around and up and down. What's neat is that, if they move towards each other, they naturally move towards the center, the source or hub of the spokes. When you move towards others, reaching out with love, you naturally move towards the source of

Love, which is just another way of thinking about God. But the more you distance yourself from God, the more distance exists between the spokes, too – so you are further away from others.

In this way, we see that we are one, in that we are all on the ship's wheel. No matter how it rotates, we are all one in our connections. Yet, we are also all uniquely placed, with our own view and identity that helps to maintain the wheel. After all, if everyone were on just one spoke, there would be no wheel at all – it would be more like a pogo stick than a wheel!

If you look carefully at the image, you'll notice a number of different symbols that represent this tension, this mystery, in different ways. At the center, for instance, is a trinity knot, an ancient symbol that has been used to represent the Trinity. Note that the three "points" are connected in one continuous line, and the circle emphasizes its one-ness. At the same time, the three points are distinct, and it maintains its unique three-ness.

All of this is to say: let us strive to be One, as Jesus calls us – and let us also see the beauty of our uniqueness and experience, as the Trinity shows us. Amen.


